Dear Parents, Guardians, Carers,

As we approach the end of a truly remarkable academic year, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on the incredible vibrancy and uplifting spirit that has filled Hyde Park. It has been a period where our pupils across the school have truly embraced exciting opportunities to learn, explore, and shine. The energy, creativity, and curiosity shown by every child continues to be a source of immense pride for all of us.

This year, our youngest pupils in Early Years have truly had a flying start to their education. We've continued to see the power of imaginative play, with Reception pupils building obstacle courses, royal thrones, and even putting on performances with handmade microphones. Across the rest of the school, pupils have been immersed in a diverse array of engaging and enriching activities. A particular highlight has been the resounding success of our **ProBleu project exhibition**. From unforgettable rock pooling trips and insightful visits from marine scientists to creative workshops at The Box, the exhibition beautifully showcased their dedication and the remarkable impact of hands-on learning in fostering our future ocean citizens.

Our pupils have also explored the power of music throughout the year. They've made beautiful melodies, diligently practising with glockenspiels to complement songs they've been learning. This musical exploration isn't just about notes; it nurtures creativity and discipline, helping pupils to express themselves and collaborate effectively, whilst also developing cognitive skills like memory and problem-solving. We saw fantastic musical collaboration as pupils worked together, rehearsing and performing pieces for each other. Learning has taken exciting forms beyond the classroom too. Pupils embarked on exhilarating journeys into the world of **3D shapes**, exploring properties and constructing their own

models with everyday materials, igniting a passion for geometry. They stepped outside for dynamic sessions of **Grammar Orienteering**, combining English and physical activity in a fun and engaging way, using teamwork and problem-solving to navigate challenges. Financial literacy was also a focus, with pupils exploring the importance of saving, budgeting, and making wise choices through interactive activities. Scientific curiosity also blasted off as pupils delved into space units, immersing themselves in imagery and facts, imagining their own planets, and crafting detailed reports.

Beyond these specific highlights, it's been an exciting (and very busy!) year at school. In writing, our pupils have been creating magical portals to inspire their stories, they've loved imagining the worlds beyond them! We also had an amazing circus workshop where everyone got to try their hand at juggling, riding unicycles, walking the tightrope, and spinning diabolos. There were lots of laughs, a few wobbles, and plenty of new skills learned!

Throughout the year, our commitment to a rich and varied curriculum has seen many more memorable moments. Our pupils have engaged with crucial themes, from celebrating the vibrant traditions of our Harvest Festival to enchanting audiences with our heartfelt Christmas productions. We've seen a fantastic display of literary enthusiasm during World Book Day, with costumes and shared stories bringing characters to life. Our School Council has been instrumental in ensuring pupil voice is heard, leading initiatives that benefit everyone. We've also had valuable visits from local community services, teaching important lessons on safety and citizenship. Our commitment to the wider community has shone through in various charity fundraising events, showing the incredible generosity and empathy of our school family. On the sporting front, beyond our own Sports Day, pupils have proudly represented Hyde Park in several inter-school tournaments, demonstrating excellent sportsmanship

Parent Governor - Vacancy

At the start of the next school year, starting September 2025, we have a vacancy on the Federated Governing Body (FGB) for a Parent Governor. 
Glockenspiel Fun in Year 2!
