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A Day of Discovery at The Box!


We are thrilled to share the excitement of our Year 3 pupils' recent visit to The Box, made possible through ProBleu funding! This hands-on workshop was a fantastic blend of science, art, and environmental awareness, inspiring young minds through creativity and exploration.

Scientific Discovery: Pupils designed their own exoskeletons, diving into the wonders of nature and engineering.

Artistic Expression: Through observational drawings, they captured the beauty of marine life from Plymouth and Devon.

Marine Science: They explored the fascinating world of zooplankton and phytoplankton, investigating how carbon dioxide affects our oceans.

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Exploring Numbers and the World in Reception!

Reception pupils have been developing their mathematical understanding by exploring representations of 6, 7, and 8. They have been counting accurately, sorting objects into groups, and investigating number composition using the part-part-whole method.

In addition, pupils have been immersing themselves in different environments through high-quality stories, using maps to identify and explore these locations. These activities are helping to build their understanding of the world while fostering a love of learning.



Fun Facts from Our Learning Adventures!

Number Magic – Did you know that the number 7 is often considered the world's favourite number? It appears in many places, from the seven continents to the seven colours of the rainbow!

Mapping the World – The first known map dates back over 14,000 years! Early humans used maps carved into rocks to navigate their surroundings.

Year 1 Football Fun!

Year 1 pupils have been honing their football skills in outdoor PE lessons! So far, they have mastered dribbling and stopping the ball using different parts of their feet.

This week, they worked in pairs to practise passing, adding a fun twist to their drills. If a pupil successfully kicked the ball through their partner's legs, they got to shout 'Ghostbusters!' – a fantastic way to build teamwork and accuracy while having lots of fun!



Fun Facts About Plymouth Argyle FC!

Historic Beginnings – Plymouth Argyle was founded in 1886 and turned professional in 1903, making it one of the oldest football clubs in England.

The Pilgrims' Name – The club's nickname, "**The Pilgrims**", comes from the Mayflower Pilgrims who set sail from Plymouth to America in **1620**.

Unique Green Army – Plymouth Argyle is one of the few English clubs that wears **green**, a colour more commonly associated with teams in Scotland and Ireland.

Record-Breaking Run – Argyle holds the record for the **most Football League Third Division South titles (4)**, an achievement unmatched by any other club.

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Year 3 Explores Ancient Egypt with Clive Pig!

Recently, our Year 3 pupils took a thrilling journey back in time with the talented Clive Pig, bringing the world of Ancient Egypt to life! Through interactive drama activities, they deepened their understanding of mummification and ancient farming practices.

Did you know that the Ancient Egyptians preferred onions over apples? Our young historians were fascinated by the unique aspects of daily life in ancient times while stepping into the roles of pharaohs, farmers, and embalmers. A truly unforgettable experience that made history come alive!



Fun Facts About Ancient Egypt!

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Safeguarding: Our Top Priority

Understanding Bullying vs. Friendship Issues

Recently, we have noticed that the term "**bullying**" is being used more frequently, sometimes in situations that do not meet the definition of bullying. It's important to remember that **bullying is repeated, intentional behaviour meant to hurt someone emotionally or physically**, whereas **friendship issues and disagreements** can be a normal part of growing up.

If your child experiences a conflict with a peer, we encourage open discussions at home about **resolving disagreements positively**. However, if there are persistent concerns about **bullying**, please do not hesitate to reach out so we can **address the situation appropriately**.

We strongly encourage parents to **monitor online activity**, set **appropriate boundaries**, and **use parental controls** to ensure a safe digital environment.

Here are some key **online safety tips** for half-term:

- ✔ **Monitor screen time** – Set limits and encourage breaks from devices.
- ✔ **Enable parental controls** – Use filters to block inappropriate content on devices and apps.
- ✔ **Check privacy settings** – Ensure your child's accounts are set to **private** and they only connect with **trusted people**.
- ✔ **Talk about online behaviour** – Remind children that **being kind online** is just as important as in person.
- ✔ **Encourage safe gaming and social media use** – Be aware of who they are interacting with and what they are sharing.
