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Visit to Plymouth Islamic Centre

Recently, our Year 3 children visited Plymouth Islamic Centre to experience what it is like inside a mosque and to learn more about the Islamic faith. The children experienced Muslim customs, such as removing their shoes before entering the mosque. Some of the children and staff also chose to wear a headscarf as is the custom for mosques. They listened to Islamic stories and the children had the opportunity to ask many questions which deepened their learning. It was an educational session, and both the children and staff learnt a lot.



Tally Charts

In Maths, Year 2 have been learning about tally charts. As a class activity, the children created tally charts to record how many cars, bikes, motorbikes, and people went past the school during five minutes. They saw a lot of cars! The children then transferred their learning by working independently in the classroom to create their own tally charts to record how many people liked grapes, oranges, or pears.
